This spacious detached house was built in the 1960's and is set in a lovely large garden. It is situated on a leafy residential area, close to one of the main roads into Belfast.

The house is within walking distance of a local park and has easy access to shops, several churches, leisure centre and other local amenities. There is a basic newsagent with milk just a couple of minutes walk & a big Tesco, & some eating places less than 5 minutes' drive. Central Belfast is 15 mins drive. Their road connects to the Belfast ring-road (after a few minutes' drive) with easy access to the sea, woods, hills and other local towns, all within 20-30 mins drive. While Belfast is the thriving capital city

in terms of its many amenities & attractions, it's more of a big town in terms of size/ease of getting out and exploring the rest of Ireland! This is a wonderful location for a holiday. See area websites below.

This house is spacious and up-to-date, with a large lounge, well-fitted kitchen, dining room, cloakroom and toilet downstairs, as well as an extra TV room/conservatory next to the kitchen leading out to the garden. The bathroom has a shower as well as bath. There is a washing machine and dishwasher, rotary line outside, and airdryers inside but no tumble drier. 3 TVs (2 downstairs in living room and conservatory and one in king-size bedroom) – virgin on main TV, Netflix on other 2. 2 DVD-players and selection of DVDs, various boardgames, Wii, good Wifi.There is high speed internet access and a choice of three TVs – one has Virgin TV package, and the other two stream a range of content. They have a large partially enclosed garden with lawn and shrubs at the front, and the rear garden has a patio, lawn, shrubs and a summer house/shed. It's a lovely spacious garden with trees along the back and fairly private, as only overlooked by a few neighbours on one side, but with fencing between. They have a large trampoline, swing ball, box of balls etc. in summer house, tennis-table in garage and netball hoop. As the family own a dog, there is a dog cage/run at the side of the garden with an attached kennel & a wire long-lead screwed into the ground. House swappers who bring their own dog are welcome to use this.

The family's church, which is very close by, is St.John's Orangefield which is 'Church of Ireland'.

There are three very different services each Sunday and house swappers are sure to receive a warm welcome to whichever service they go to.

10 am is informal and contemporary with a band, screen, tea & coffee etc. (40-50 people attending including the children),

11.30 is traditional – pews, organ & choir-led hymns, uses the Book of Common Prayer, (60-70 adults)

6.30 is quieter and more reflective using various liturgies e.g. celtic, with both traditional and modern music led by a piano and visuals on screen (20-30 adults)

Sport and Leisure	local leisure centre (10 mins drive) with a 25m pool, gym & fitness classes, and a swimming baths about the same distance away. The local park has playing fields with regular games of football & rugby, plenty of space to walk dogs, cycle (it is part of the Belfast greenway – you can cycle to Comber which is some 10 miles away through beautiful countryside), rollerblade, skateboard & more! We are also about half an hour's walk from the Kingspan stadium, home to Ulster rugby.
Free park	local park with an enclosed children's play area with swings and slides, climbing equipment, a roundabout etc. It also has basic gym machines on various routes that anyone can use, and tennis/basketball open air courts.
