This home is located in a quiet cul-de-sac. Bungalows surround the back garden so there is no feeling of being overlooked. Off the cul-de-sac is a main road making access to the town quick and easy. Chilwell is approximately three miles south west of Nottingham & six miles east of Derby. There are good bus and tram links to Beeston town centre and also Nottingham City Centre. You

can travel in the opposite direction to reach Derby City Centre as well. This is an excellent area to visit for a holiday as, within easy reach, there are a great variety of tourist attractions for all age groups, as well as lovely countryside to enjoy. (See area websites below)

This 1930's semi-detached house has had major building improvement in recent years. There has been extensions to the side and back of the house completed in 2017. There are two areas of the garden; a grassed area at the front, and the enclosed back garden is laid to lawn, has a patio with table and chairs and a BBQ, as well as some raised vegetable beds. (House-swappers are asked to water if staying there in dry weather, and are welcome to eat any veg. that is ready for picking!) There is also a trampoline, sandpit and a shed full of garden toys including scooters, and bikes in the garage that can be borrowed too. The nearest shop & pub are within 5 mins walk and there is off-road parking by the house. (more photos below)

The family attend Christ Church Chilwell where over 200 people meet across two morning services and there is a good mix of traditional & contemporary styles of worship.
