This detached house is located on a quiet cul-de-sac in Teg Down, the outskirts of the small city of Winchester.

It is an attractive 1960s housing estate which has quite a spacious layout and is flanked by a golf course, park and open country. There are pleasant trees and gardens round about, with good walks to local woods and fields from the top of the estate. It is 10 minutes walk to local shops & eating places & a half hour walk from the city centre. Winchester and area have much to offer the holiday-maker, being rich in tourist attractions as well as fairly close to the coast. See area website below.



The house has an average size sitting room, not large but the suite seats 6 comfortably and space for extra seating. There is a separate dining area with table and 8 chairs, a back conservatory and a small side conservatory/music room. The garage has been converted & now doubles as a games room & usable as a bedroom. There is a small table tennis table.

The back garden is enclosed & has a sloping lawn surrounded by trees and shrubs. It's not especially well-maintained, but pleasant natural outlook. It is on the north side & there is usually choice of sun or shade if sun is out. It's peaceful to sit in and spacious and informal enough for children to play creatively in. The open front lawn has small trees and shrubs. There are garden chairs & a basic table & small bbq . There is off-road parking but it is up a steep drive so house-swappers may prefer to park on the road in front of the house.

Christchurch in Winchester is a thriving Anglican fellowship. Over 300 people attend the 9-30 am and the evening service with about 200 attending at 11-15am. There is a good mix of traditional & contemporary styles of worship and the church serves its church & local community very well. It is well known for the children's and youth work, & it is a New Wine and Alpha hub. Shorter all age services during school holidays. (Currently interregnum)
