This chalet style detached house was built in the mid 1980's and is situated on a quiet country lane amongst other individually designed houses & bungalows. It has a great location in the picture postcard village of Hoxne in rural Suffolk.

Hoxne has interesting connections with King Edmund who was captured under

Goldbrook Bridge by the Danes in circa AD570. There are pretty footpaths around the village to the shop & pub, & woodland walks to the memorial where King Edmund died. This is a truly delightful place to be with hardly more than school & farm traffic & delivery vans. The nearest shop & pub serving good food is half a mile away & closer still is the fish & chip van which calls on Thursday evenings!

There is easy access to A140 & A143 but it's far enough away to have no traffic noise. Five miles away is the market town of Diss & 35 mins drive is Ipswich, Norwich, Bury St Edmunds or 45 mins to the coast e.g. Aldeburgh, Southwold, Gorleston & Lowestoft. (area websites below)

The main features of the house are as follows:- a modern ensuite shower room & a separate family



bathroom; a downstairs toilet; kitchen & utility room. There is an attractive spacious sun room which can be used as an extra lounge and for dining. This can be opened up to become part of the sitting room & has access to patio & garden. There is WiFi & Sky TV; The fenced back garden is not overlooked and consists mainly of lawn with a choice of 3 patios with seating & a very small (unfenced) pond. Barbecue available, as is swing ball & some bats & balls in the shed.

The couple attend DC3 Harleston (part of Diss Christian Community Church) This is non-denominational, but its roots are Pentecostal with mixture of Baptists, Anglicans & unchurched people attending.

About 100 people attend the morning service & while there is no evening service there, other churches can be recommended.. eg 6.30pm Fressingfield Baptist Church 5 miles away. This is little more traditional than DC3., but also has excellent ministry. Diss have their own building & meeting starts 10am for coffee & cakes for 10.30am start.
