This 1960's detached house is situated in a quiet neighbourhood off a cul-de-sac on the edge of Golspie, a small seaside village in the Scottish Highlands. This is a great location on the Dornoch Firth, about an hour's drive north of Inverness, capital of the Highlands and Lochness. The county of Sutherland is incredibly scenic with hills, mountains. moors, rivers and lochs, stretches to the west and north coasts, about 60 miles away, with quiet beaches of white sand and azure blue sea, now quite famous

thanks to the NC 500 road route, which passes through Golspie. The region is excellent for walking, watching wildlife & golfing. Royal Dornoch, less than 10 miles away, has been rated in the top 10 courses in the world. Golspie has its own excellent course, & there are mountain biking trails on the hill right behind the house.

.From the home there is a wonderful view across fields and a golf course to the sea (Dornoch Firth 0.5 mile) with Tarbet Ness Lighthouse on the far side of the bay.

Directly behind the house is "Ben Bhraggie", a hill with paths, mountain bike trails and panoramic views. There is a path from back garden into woods, with paths & mountain bike trails & many excellent local walks, both from the village as well as across the

region including hill walks, forest and loch trails.

The back garden is enclosed and there is a large grassed area where children can play. There is a decking area, garden table & chairs a BBQ and they also have a table tennis table. Parents are asked not to let the children play in the fenced off veg. garden, or in the front garden (pictured) with its formal lawn and flowers. There is off-road parking, & they are about a ten minute walk to the village with shops & eating places.



The couple attend Dornoch Free Church which is a very friendly and welcoming fellowship. About 50 people meet for morning services & a more intimate 25 in the evenings. There is a good mix of traditional and contemporary music. They meet in a modernised building, & there is a crèche and Sunday School.
