This large Edwardian terraced house is situated on the edge of Wandsworth Common. one of London's more wooded and quieter commons with lots of play parks, sports and ponds. This is a green suburb of South West London, Zone 2 for Transport for London. It's a residential area of mostly Edwardian and Victorian red bricks, with a small handful of shops, cafés & a pub very close by. 15 minutes walk away are lots more lovely shops & eating places. The house itself is on a busy road, but pretty quiet in the house and garden. And they are in easy reach of the peace, quiet and greenery of the common.

Central London is an easy three stop train ride into Victoria from Wandsworth Common Station, or Waterloo from Clapham Junction just to the north. There are bus stops just along the road from the house and frequent buses going in all directions. This is a wonderful location to enjoy as well as serving as a great base for exploring all that London has to offer.

This 3 storey home has two bathrooms (one with bath, one with bath and separate shower), a kitchen with dining area, laundry room, living/dining room, and two small loos.

The garden is enclosed, and for a city is medium sized! There is a small lawn, fruit bushesblackcurrant, gooseberry, loganberry, cherry and a haphazard damson - and some shrubs, trees and borders. House-swappers are welcome to pick any fruit that becomes ripe, and a little watering would be appreciated if staying during a dry spell!

There is an area of decking with table, chairs, umbrella and a barbecue. Another great bonus is off-road parking, for up to two cars.

The family attend St Mary's Battersea which has a mixed congregation and is warm and welcoming. It offers traditional worship based in liturgy, with a good choir and a diversity of music is drawn upon. There is a very active commitment to the wider community and to social justice. There is great children's work which includes the use of *Godly Play* to enhance young faith experience
