This extended 1940's semi-detached house is situated in a quiet cul-de-sac in Acomb, an attractive suburb just under 2 miles from the Centre of York. It's a great base to explore the city centre (35 minutes walk or a short bus journey/drive) and a wide range of attractions around York; museums, gardens, kids activities, shopping, restaurants etc. York is regularly voted one of the best places to live and visit in the UK, and it's easy to see why with such a range of things to do in a beautiful and safe city environment. It's particularly good for families with kids, and there is a lot on offer which is free. Outside of the city itself,

you're less than 1 hour from the picturesque <u>North York Moors</u> national park, and the vibrant urban centre of <u>Leeds</u>. From the house it's 10 minutes walk to the fantastic West Bank Park; the local hub of Acomb high street; and upmarket café, Bluebird Bakery.

The centrepiece of the house is a large extended open plan kitchen/living room comprising a sofa area with a log fire, large wooden dinner table, piano and a spacious kitchen with island. It's great for socialising, eating, dancing (there are speakers in the ceiling!), playing the piano or cosying up on an evening! There is also a relaxing lounge with television and hifi with the ability to cast media by wifi. Outside, there is parking on the driveway and front and rear gardens. The enclosed rear garden has a raised decking area with an outdoor dining table and chairs, mud kitchen, and usually colourful potted flowers. There is a small patch of grass



with flower borders, and young children will be happy to discover the slide, mud kitchen, a selection of garden toys and a tree house!
