This semi-detached bungalow was built in the early 1930's and now includes a loft conversion. It's in a convenient location just outside Oxford. Kidlington claims to be one of the largest villages in the UK, and has a great range of facilities. The home is situated on a main road, with regular, direct buses for the 20-30 minute journey into Oxford City Centre. The nearby Oxford Parkway Station runs frequent trains taking you into central London within an hour. Alternatively you can head out into the beautiful Cotswolds, visit the nearby Blenheim Palace, or go shopping in Witney or Bicester town, or Bicester Village for designer outlets.

A few doors away is a clean and well-stocked Co-op. A 5 minute walk takes you to the village High Street with a choice of restaurants, takeaways and pubs, coffee shops, supermarkets and charity shops as well as a small shopping centre with a variety of independent businesses, and market day is on Fridays and Saturdays. ³/₄ mile in the other direction is a large Sainsbury's supermarket. Oxfordshire is a beautiful county to visit having so many and varied things to do and see for all age groups. See area websites below.

There is a separate lounge; the dining room opens to the kitchen which includes a dishwasher, and the utility room includes the washing machine. Four bedrooms, the shower/toilet room and another separate toilet are on the ground floor. In the loft conversion is a single room with cabin bed and ensuite bathroom (shower over bath). There has been a lot of renovation work in recent years, some of which is not quite finished. Some of the hallway is not fully carpeted, but it is safe and functional. They don't have a TV, but internet access is good. There is off-road parking.

The medium sized enclosed garden faces south west, and is mostly laid to lawn with two patio/seating areas for a choice of shade or sun. There is a garden table, chairs and a barbecue. The visiting foxes and badgers do a bit of damage, and we are still renovating parts, so it is not perfectly manicured!

The family attend Grace Church Kidlington which is an Independent Evangelical Church (FIEC). Their regular meeting is at 4pm, and twice a month this is followed by a seminar session at 5.40pm. "These are well worth staying for so, take a packed tea if you would like to eat between the two sessions!" Grace Church is a recent plant from Woodstock Road Baptist Church in Oxford,

Sport and Leisure	There is a free outdoor gym at Exeter Park, just a few minutes walk from the house. Kidlington & Gosford Leisure Centre half a mile away includes an indoor gym & swimming pool. There are long and short walking and cycle routes, including alongside the canal or the river and through Stratfield Brake Nature Reserve. In Oxford itself are several other swimming pools and many other sporting opportunities, such as Oxford Brookes Climbing Centre and Oxford Ice Rink. Bicester offers a trampoline park and a performance centre for open water swimming and an assault course.
