Bath itself is a beautiful city, and 'there is a regular bus service that can bring you back up the hill to our village.' There are some delightful villages and country walks nearby, and easy driving access to towns and cities such as Bradford-on-Avon, Bristol and Wells. This is a great place to holiday!

The home consists of the kitchen,
