This 1950's semi-detached house is situated on what was a council estate, but most houses are now privately owned. Despite the built-up area, the house is in a close with wide verges both sides, so it's quiet and not overlooked.

There are some low-rise flats nearby, and the house is set on a hill where there is a great view from the back of the house, overlooking the QE2 bridge into Essex and over and beyond Dartford, 10 plus miles. They are 15 minutes drive from The Elizabeth Line, where there is some free parking.

The trains run into London every 5 minutes, with arrival to Tottenham Court Rd in 22 minutes from Abbey Wood. Also within easy reach are three other mainline stations with trains running every half an hour, in to Cannon Street or Charing Cross This is a great location for enjoying the city of London, local towns and yet easy access to lovely countryside; in general a huge variety of interesting places to visit and things to do.

On the ground floor of the house is a cosy front room, where the TV is, and a more open plan back room with kitchen, dining area and sitting room. This has floor to ceiling windows all along the outside wall with two sky lights. It overlooks the garden and faces east.

The small enclosed garden is laid to lawn with an herbaceous border, fruit trees/bushes and two raised beds for veg, and a greenhouse. It gets the sun all day till about 6 o'clock in the summer. There are garden chairs table and a big umbrella. They would appreciate watering the garden, and house-swappers asked to please help themselves to any veg that's ready.

The couple are a key part of Wilmington Independent Community Church, which is 5 miles from their home. About 100 people meet for the Sunday morning service which has a good mix of traditional and contemporary worship.

*House-swappers need to know that they have two male lodgers. They both cook for themselves; one uses the kitchen for about 1/2hr a day and uses the front room to watch the TV while he prepares and eats his meal. The other sometimes does a bit of cooking often on a Sunday morning when we are out. Other than that, they are in their rooms or out. They use the bathroom on the first floor, which is where their rooms are. There is a toilet on the ground floor and a shower room on the second floor. The lodgers are out all day Monday to Friday. One or other of them may be away in August. They are both very easy-going and it won't be awkward being in the same house! Actually, you will see very little of them.
