This early 1960's detached house is situated in a quiet residential area, which has a good mix of families and retired folk. It's made up of detached houses with large gardens, driveways and garages. There are lovely far-reaching views of the South Downs and 'big skies'! It's 3 miles inland from Eastbourne seafront, and within easy reach of the South Downs and beautiful Sussex countryside to explore, as well as the seaside.

The house has had a few extensions since it was built. There is a large kitchen area with central island and adjoining eating area; a double range cooker, dishwasher & washing machine.

The cosy lounge has an L shaped settee and a piano; TV has Freeview and there are lots of DVDs. The conservatory has a sofa, and the toys are in here. (It's warm in summer, cold in winter.) There is a downstairs toilet and shower room.

And a family bathroom with shower over bath upstairs. The master bedroom is ensuite and will be available if more than one couple is staying, otherwise the other double bedded room is available.

The 100 ft enclosed garden is south facing so gets lots of sunshine. The decking is being re-done in 2024, and they have garden furniture and a barbecue.
