This 1960's two storey flat is in a low-rise block and situated in a fairly quiet area away from the busy roads. Although in the middle of a large city, Hoxton is a close community within Hackney and Greater London. There are lots of shops, cafés and restaurants in easy walking distance. You can eat around the world here. There are parks and playgrounds close by and it is easy to catch a bus or the Tube into Central London to see all the sights, visit museums and the West End theatres. The area is very densely populated and there are many blocks of flats and

terraced houses, but it is generally fairly quiet for an inner city area. Sometimes there is noise from neighbours or people going home in the evenings, but in general it is quiet.

"We are surrounded by community gardens which means we get a fair number of birds and squirrels in the garden. The garden is overlooked by high rise blocks, but these are somewhat screened by the trees. Parking is away from the font door so be prepared to carry your cases a short distance! We can arrange for you to buy parking vouchers which are valid anywhere within the designated Zone F." (See note at end)

The nearest bus stop is 200m, King's Cross railway station is 10 minutes on the tube from Old Street. Hoxton has an overground station.

The well designed flat has a large open plan lounge/diner/kitchen downstairs and a toilet. Upstairs are the two double rooms and one single. (There is also an office which is not available to house-swappers.)

The TV has a Fire-stick with access to Netflix, YouTube and Disney Plus. Swappers should be able to access their Amazon Prime account via the TV. They have Alexa for music etc.

The small enclosed garden has artificial turf, a patio and garden furniture. The fire pit and barbecue can be used, but very carefully because of the plastic grass! "There's a gazebo in the garden which we could put up if required, but we ask the swappers not to move or adjust it." There are no garden toys for children, but playgrounds are very close by.

St John the Baptist, Hoxton is is a low key charismatic evangelical style with a diverse congregation and a great youth and children's work. The congregation represent and serve the community well, and there are a number of mid week ministries. About 100 people attend the morning service. The building is very interesting with a beautiful painted ceiling. House-swappers are sure to receive a warm welcome. www.stjohnshoxton.org.uk
