This detached house is situated at the end of a 'dead-end' road on the outskirts of York. It's a modern residential estate, just a few minutes walk to a bus stop with a regular service into the city centre, and 10 mins drive to a 'park and ride'. It's also 5 mins drive, or 15 mins walk to Morrisons and other shops, cafes and pubs in the nearby village of Acomb. York has many places to visit & experience; a wonderful city with lots to do and see for all ages.

The original part of this house was built in 1983 and it has been

extended/altered over the years. It comprises a large entrance hall & cloakroom, living room with TV, DVD, log burner and piano, a large kitchen/diner with usual amenities, a sun-room, a playroom with plenty of toys for all ages, and a downstairs toilet/shower/wet room. (They are soon going to have work done to make the playroom also a spare room with sofa bed so potential for 2 more to sleep later in the 2024.)

The large double garage is linked to the house and is used for storage but also has a small trampoline, gymnastics bar, beam & mat.

Upstairs is a large bedroom with king-size bed, 'Juliet balcony' & space for cot, and 2

single bedrooms. The family bathroom has a shower over the bath. Small study will be out of bounds. WiFi available throughout.

The good-sized enclosed garden is mostly laid to lawn with a large patio. There are table and chairs for 6, a parasol, BBQ, sun chairs and a swing seat.





On the lawn is a metal climbing frame and swing. A large framed swimming pool with filter is up and available during the summer holidays, & there will be instructions for procedure of this! More storage is in the stables containing bikes, scooters & other outdoor toys that can be used, all except one bike, but we'll make it clear which one. There is parking for 2 cars on a driveway.

The family attend Gateway Church in Acomb, York, just a 15

minute walk away. A lively church for all ages where house-swappers will be very welcome. Another Gateway Church family also lives on the same street and can assist and advise as needed.
