This English-speaking missionary family live near Rocchetta Tanaro, a village near Asti, in the centre of the Piedmont Region of northwest Italy. This is a beautiful, rural area with wonderful countryside, vineyards.

About 1 hour's drive from the Italian Riviera & about the same to Turin & many lovely places to visit. They live down an unpaved road, near

a slowmoving

stream (sometimes completely dry, depending on the rainfall of the year) and at about 700 metres, a slow-moving shallow river.

No neighbours except an occasional wild hog, pheasant, badger or fox.

Gentle wooded hills rise literally from their front yard to the Natural Park of Rocchetta

Tanaro. A hundred year-old ruin is near the house and another across the slow-moving brook.

The village centre is about 3 minutes away by car or an hour on foot, and is home to an ancient family of nobility (Incisa della Rocchetta) that has called this area their home since the 1200's.

ASTI, the city about 25 minutes away, has a colourful and vibrant open-air market Wednesdays and Saturdays. Start early in


Asti is famous for foods and wine, and just south (25-30 minutes by car) are the world-famous vineyards of Barolo and Barbaresco. Public transport is not great here so a car is essential. (A car may be available for house-swappers.

There is a large, hedged garden – completely private, plus 4-5 areas under shade-cloth. They grow a lot of plants in pots, so daily watering is a must in the heat of the summer.

This is a wonderfully peaceful garden with trees, nearby brook, fields and forest, hills & rolling countryside. Al fresco eating in the cool of the evening on the covered outdoor tables is a joy. They have a small & large barbecue for house swappers to use, and plenty of seating areas. (more photos below)

	pools are about 25-30 minutes either to the east near Alessandria or to
	the west in Asti. It is possible to swim in parts of the river nearby.
Local places of	Our strongest points are the smaller-city ambience of Asti with its famed
interest	culinary delights. Pedestrian zones with shopping as well as open-air

	cafes and restaurants make up part of the Asti experience. But not to forget the wine-growing areas just minutes away in Barbaresco and the Langue with vineyards covering hills as far as the eye can see.
	Also we are not far from the Italian Riviera (1 hour south) with its clusters of villages, palm-lined narrow streets and restaurants along the sea and Turin – a majestic city of the kings of Italy – with grand avenues, buildings, the old residences of the Savoy dynasty as well as the largest Egyptian museum outside of Egypt. Milan is 1.5 hours away. Florence is 3.5 hours away (by car, but we also have good train connections to a few destinations here in the north.)
