This early 1970's terraced town house is situated in the centre of Veurne, a beautiful small town with medieval roots . It has a big square with a weekly market on Wednesdays. Right outside of town there are a lot of cycle paths through the fields. The sea is a 10 minute drive by car or a 30 minute cycle. The motorway is right next to Veurne, making it

easily accessible from Calais- 50 minutes, or Dunkirk- 30 mins. Veurne also has a train station, & local buses to explore the area. There are 2 electrical bikes with a bike trailer for kids, and house-swappers are welcome to use these.

As well as kitchen/diner/living room, there is a downstairs toilet & upstairs bathroom with toilet. The first floor has the master double bedroom, 1 kids room & 1 spare room which has a single bed that can slide out to a double bed. The second floor has a single bedroom/office. Wifi is throughout the house, & there's a chromecast without a remote in the TV, so house-swappers can cast things from a mobile device. There's no garden as such, but there is a small private patio outside (5x2m)

with 4 chairs, a small table and a toddler slide.

There's a park with a kids playground next to the city square, and another with open green spaces 300m away. It's called Vauban Parc.





'Vineyard Kerk Veurne' is a small church plant with 20 people attending each Sunday. It's part of the Vineyard movement and has a mix of a contemplative and contemporary style of worship, and is a friendly fellowship. Their meetings take place in the chapel of the Annuntiata Institute in Veurne.
