While this is an urban location, the back gate of the garden leads to the Oldbury old mainline canal less than 10 metres behind garden! And a really nice walk along here.




Playground/park/ sport


For sports, many of the above local parks have open space, some have sports fields/facilities. The Sandwell Aquatic centre, which hosted the swimming for the 2022 Commonwealth Games, is also a 10-minute drive.

Recommended

In addition to the many local parks and nature reserves, the house is a 5-minute drive from the famous Black Country Living Museum places of interest in Dudley, which is also just around the corner from Dudley Castle and Zoo. Ironbridge and RAF Cosford Museum are about a 40minute drive away. For shopping, the Merry Hill Centre is a 15minute drive, and Ikea at Wednesbury is a 20-minute drive away, and of course Birmingham City Centre is close to get to - a 20-30 minute drive or a 10 minute train journey from Sandwell & Dudley station which is nearby (20 minutes walking from the house).
